Bomb: The Race to Build and Steal the World's Most Dangerous Weapon
by Steve Sheinkin (2012)
Non-Fiction
920L, 266 pages

A discovery by a German chemist in 1938 showed the world how to split uranium, launching a scientific race that spanned three continents and pit politicians, scientists, and spies against one another as nations fought to be the first to create an atomic bomb.

Code Talker: A Novel about the Navajo Marines of World War Two by Joseph Bruchac (2006) Historical Fiction NA,240 pages

Navajo men played a unique role in saving American lives in World War II, sending messages to and from the front lines in an unbreakable code based on their native language. Sixteen-year-old Ned Begay joins the code talkers, braving some of the heaviest fighting of the war as part of this crucial team.

Endangered by Eliot Schrefer (2012) Adventure 900L, 272 pages

During a summer visit to the Congo, 14-year-old Sophie develops a deep attachment to Otto, a young ape living on her mother's bonobo sanctuary. When a civil war breaks out around them and the sanctuary is attacked, Sophie is forced to go on the run and survive solo in the jungle in

order to save herself and Otto.

The False Prince by Jennifer A. Nielsen (2012) Fantasy 710L, 342 pages
Carthyan nobleman Conner has collected four orphans to train in the ways of royalty as part of a plot to take over the throne by impersonating the country's missing (and presumed dead)
Prince Jaron. Sage, clever and unruly, charming and annoying, stands out among the orphans while threatening to become a foil to Conner's wicked plan.

Freak the Mighty by Rodman Philbrick (1993) Realistic Fiction 1000L, 169 pages
Two boys—a slow learner stuck in the body of a teenage giant and a tiny Einstein in leg
braces—forge a unique friendship when they pair up to create one formidable human force.

Into the Wild by Erin Hunter (2003) Fantasy 790L, 288 pages
For generations, four Clans of wild cats have shared the forest according to the laws laid down by their ancestors. Now, the warrior code is threatened by mysterious deaths. The ThunderClan cats are in grave danger while the sinister ShadowClan grows stronger every day. A housecat named Rusty may turn out to be the bravest warrior of all.

Dystopian Fiction HL710L, 305 pages

June is a prodigy being groomed for the Republic's highest military circles. Day is the country's most wanted and creative criminal. When June's brother is killed and Day becomes the prime suspect, the pair is thrust together unexpectedly as they uncover the sinister truth about the Republic.

The Lions of Little Rock by Kristin Levine (2012) Historical Fiction 630L, 298 pages

Against the backdrop of the tumultuous integration of Little Rock schools in 1958, awkward 12year-old Marlee finally finds a friend in bold new girl, Liz. Then Liz disappears from school and
rumors fly that she was a Negro passing as white. Determined to remain friends, the girls must
face the danger their friendship could mean for both families.

The Lost Hero by Rick Riordan (2010) Fantasy 660L, 576 pages

Jason, Piper, and Leo have been at the Wilderness School, a boarding school for "bad kids." As if that weren't misfortune enough, a freak storm hits during a trip on a school bus. Strange creatures whisk the trio to Camp Half-Blood, where they learn they are demigods and called to a quest to free Hera, who is being held prisoner by Mother Earth.

One for the Murphys by Linda Mullaly Hunt (2012) Realistic Fiction 520L, 228 pages

Carley has learned to be tough and street-smart as part of her chaotic life with her mother in

Las Vegas. When a shocking betrayal lands her in foster care, she is blindsided by the cheerful,

stable Murphy family who show her the kind of family life she never thought existed. When her

mother wants her back, Carley has to decide where and how to live.

Poison by Bridget Zinn (2013)

The Ruins of Gorlan by John Flanagan (2004) Fantasy 920L, 256 pages

Orphaned Will, raised in the castle by a kindly Baron, is desperate to be chosen to apprentice to the Battleschool. When Choosing Day has come and gone, Will is crushed to find himself apprenticed to the dour and mysterious Ranger Halt. Little does he suspect that his placement with the Ranger force will lead him to adventures beyond his wildest dreams.

Shooting Kabul by N.H. Senzai (2010) Historical Fiction 800L, 272 pages
In the chaos of escaping from Afghanistan, 12-year-old Fadi and his parents become tragically separated from his sister, Miriam. Struggling to adjust to life in the United States and grief-stricken about his sister, Fadi learns of a photography competition with a grand prize of a trip to India. He sees a chance to return to Afghanistan and one last hope of finding Miriam.
